





Visa Requirements/Visa Waiver Program

Participants from outside the United States may need to apply for a visa at the American Embassy, Consulate or other visa-issuing office in their country of origin. To obtain a visa, you will need a letter of invitation, a valid passport, a photo ID and a completed Form DS-156 (non-immigrant visa application form).

To request an invitation letter, you must first register for the meeting. Once you have registered, you may request your invitation letter by emailing events@sirona.com.

You are encouraged to start your visa application process as soon as possible. Some U.S. embassies and consulates may require a face-to-face interview for non-immigrant visa applications. Apply for your visa at least three to four months before the meeting.
